


Ed Smith

Alice Kinsella is a poet and writer from Mayo. Her debut, *Milk: on motherhood and madness* was published by Picador in 2023 to critical acclaim. She co-authored *Wake of the Whale* (Mayo Books Press, 2024) a hybrid docu-poetry nonfiction book on the Mullet peninsula whaling stations. Wake of the Whale was selected as a Sunday Independent Book of the Year 2024 and won the Mayo County Council Cathaoirleach Best Publication Award.

Dedicated to climate conscious art, Alice co-edited *Empty House: poetry and prose on the climate crisis* (Doire Press, 2021); she also writes about the mammalian experience and creating through emergency on her substack (mam)mal. Her debut full-length poetry collection, *The Ethics of Cats*, will be published in June 2025. She is an Arts Council of Ireland Next Generation Artist.

8:00PM - Echoes of the West with Ger Reidy and Diarmaid Moynihan

Ger Reidy and Diarmaid Moynihan come together for an entertaining evening where poetry and music intertwine. The audience will be brought on a journey through landscape, memory and emotion. This unique collaboration captures the rhythm of the west.

Ger Reidy's first collection of poetry, *Pictures from a Reservation*, was published in 1998. He has been published in many literary journals, both at home and abroad, and has read at numerous festivals, including the Cuirt Festival in Galway in 2016 and in 2010, where his second collection, *Drifting under the Moon*, was launched. He has received bursaries from the arts council and from Mayo County Council.

His third collection *Before Rain* was shortlisted for the Piggot Prize and his collection of short stories *Jobs for a Wet Day* was nominated for the Edge Hill Prize. He has been translated into Turkish and Russian and has won several poetry prizes. His latest poetry collection *Clay*, was published in April 2024.



Diarmaid Moynihan is regarded as one of Ireland's most creative uilleann pipers and composers. He was tutored initially by the late Tomás O' Canainn at the Cork School of Music before developing his own very distinctive style. After founding the groundbreaking band Calico, who released two award winning albums, Diarmaid has gone on to work with many cutting edge folk musicians including Donal Lunny, Alain Stivell, Liam O' Maonlaí, Guidewires, John Spillane, British jazz pioneers Carmina and many others.

He has long been admired as one of the most lyrical composers working today in Irish Traditional Music and his pieces have been recorded by some of traditional music's greatest musicians including Lunasa, Flook, Michael McGoldrick, Anxo Lorenzo and Cherish the Ladies. He has appeared on many TV and radio shows and has written the theme music for a number of documentaries on TG4. His most recent contributions to the screen have been to provide music for two Des Kilbane productions, An Croí Trodach and Fists of Bronze based on the extraordinary life of Achill's own Johnny Kilbane. Diarmaid was a recipient of The Henrich Boll Residency during April 2022, which is awarded to composers across the Arts disciplines to work on new creative pieces at the North Mayo base. He hosts his own world music radio show, The Wandering Minstrel, every Saturday between 5-6 p.m. on www.crcfm.ie

Louise Nealon is an Irish author from County Kildare, best known for her acclaimed debut novel, <code>Snowflake</code>. She studied English literature at Trinity College Dublin and completed a master's degree in creative writing at Queen's University Belfast in 2016. In 2017, she won the Seán Ó Faoláin International Short Story Competition and received the Francis Ledwidge Creative Writing Award. Her short stories have been published in <code>The Irish Times</code>, <code>Southword</code>, and <code>The Open Ear</code>. Nealon currently lives on her family's dairy farm, where she divides her time between writing and farming .

Snowflake, published in 2021, is a coming-of-age novel that follows Debbie White, an 18-year-old from a rural dairy farm in Kildare, as she navigates the challenges of transitioning to university life at Trinity College Dublin. The novel explores themes of mental health, family dynamics, and the complexities of growing up. It received critical acclaim and won the Sunday Independent Newcomer of the Year award at the An Post Irish Book Awards in 2021. In 2024, Snowflake was selected as the One Dublin One Book choice, further cementing its impact on contemporary Irish literature.

Nealon's work has been praised for its emotional depth, wit, and honest portrayal of young adulthood. Her unique voice and storytelling continue to resonate with readers, establishing her as a significant figure in modern Irish fiction.
